FlyHealthy@SEA this Fall

The safety, health and well-being of our employees and passengers are our priority at SEA. In response to the pandemic, we launched FlyHealthy@SEA, a layered, multi-phased action plan to employee and traveler health.

We escalated cleaning and disinfecting, implemented physical distancing, and added touchless technologies. We require all passengers, visitors, and employees at SEA Airport to wear face coverings.

Keep an eye out for our Mask Up SEA Street Team, airport employees who roam the terminals distributing SEA Care Kits to travelers or employees without masks or face coverings. So far, volunteers handed out over 6,500 SEA Care Kits!

You can also pick up a mask at our Info Hub, located at the ticketing level between checkpoints 3

checkpoints 3 and 4.

By the numbers:

 Spritzed, sprayed, and dispensed over 1,268 gallons of hand sanitizer, more than 5,012 ounces of disinfecting spray and 1,394 containers of sanitizer wipes 85 percent of airport dining and retail tenants are open

- 85 percent of airport dining and retail tenants are open
- Added over 250 hand sanitizer stations throughout the terminal
- Added almost 5,000 signs and floor decals with reminders for physical distancing and close to 300 plastic protective barriers installed that buffer interactions between passengers and airport workers

Be Counted: Complete the Census by Sept. 30

Every 10 years, we have an opportunity to shape our community's future. As a growing community, completing the 2020 Census helps the federal government and local leaders direct critical services fairly and where they are most needed.

The census is how we count people living in the country — every resident, regardless of immigration status. There is still time to complete the census, but act soon — the deadline is September 30.

Funding for hospitals, education, social services, public transportation, infrastructure projects, and emergency response all depend upon accurate census population counts. Census data also determines our community's representation at a local, state, and federal level.

We all use these resources and we all pay taxes, whether we are citizens, residents, undocumented migrants or temporary workers. This is our time to join together and make sure each and every person is seen and counted.

SEA Restauranteurs Support Essential Workers

Daniel Nguyen and Katherine Lam, owners of Bambuza Vietnam Kitchen, love giving back to their community, whether through distributing care packages for the homeless or partnering with local schools.

They saw how COVID-19 was impacting their communities and found an opportunity to make a difference.

Nguyen and Lam started AntoGen Outfitters, named for their daughters Antoinette and Genevieve, to provide free face coverings to non-profit community service organizations that care for low-income and underserved populations in the region.

To turn their venture from a dream to reality, they connected with a

factory in Vietnam to develop a line of comfortable cloth face coverings for sale to individuals, businesses, organizations, and public agencies. Sales from these face coverings help fund free distribution to those in need.

An initial donation of 5,000 cloth face coverings is being distributed throughout the Seattle and Portland regions. Over time, Lam and Nguyen plan to donate 100,000 face coverings to farmworkers, domestic workers, food service, and grocery workers in need.

Every purchase of AntoGen's Triple-Layer Comfort Mask helps fund more grants to more people in the community. The Port purchased 4,000 of their face coverings



for dining and retail tenants and airport workers to keep SEA safe for employees and travelers.

All sales will fund donations of face coverings to vulnerable populations in our region.
