

RESOLUTION NO. 3017

A RESOLUTION of the Port Commission of the Port of Seattle marking the official commencement of the Port of Seattle's 1987 United Way campaign on September 8, 1987

WHEREAS, the Port of Seattle is a publicly-owned organization in King County that plays a leadership role in the region's economic development; and

WHEREAS, Port employees have proved their concern for the social welfare of their neighbors in King County by participating in numerous activities that benefit disadvantaged people; and

WHEREAS, the social welfare of some of our neighbors continues to be jeopardized by inadequate supplies of food, clothing, shelter medical and counseling assistance and educational opportunities; and

WHEREAS, United Way is a leader, nationwide, in offering human, administrative and financial resources to over 143 separate agencies that, in turn, seek to improve the quality of life for our people.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Port of Seattle Commission, Executive Director James D. Dwyer, and all Port of Seattle employees will accept the challenge of participating in the 1987 United Way Campaign and strive to surpass the levels of participation and contributions set by the Port in previous years.

ADOPTED by the Port Commission of the Port of Seattle at a regular meeting held this 8th day of September, 1987 and duly authenticated in open session with the signatures of the Commissioners voting in favor thereof and the Seal of the Commission.
