The Port of Seattle and the Seattle Aquarium will collaborate on a project to study and map the presence of kelp forests along the urban waterfront of Elliott Bay as well as East and West Waterways of Seattle Harbor. The Commission allocated funding to restore kelp forests in the Port's 2022 budget. Growing kelp beds is an essential part of the action plan for the Smith Cove Blue Carbon project to build and preserve habitat.

RECAP APRIL 26: The Port Commission issued a Holocaust Remembrance Day Proclamation, and heard a Baggage Optimization Program Update – Second Quarter 2022, and a presentation on the Sustainable Century and Fly Quiet Awards.

The Port Commission also authorized an agreement with the Seattle Aquarium for a project investigating Urban Kelp Forest, and a cooperative research and development agreement with Pacific Northwest National Labs, Sandia National Labs and Seattle City Light to study risk assessment of large-scale hydrogen storage in a Port environment.
