## SEA Previews C Concourse Expansion Improvements



Seattle-Tacoma International Airport (SEA) revealed 30 percent design renderings of its next capital improvement project. The Concourse C Expansion will span the C and D Concourses with 145,530 more square feet of dining and retail, sought-after amenities such as an Interfaith Prayer and Meditation Room and Nursing Suite, and an all-new, more than 20,000-square-foot Alaska Airlines Lounge. The project will elevate SEA, literally, by adding four additional floors above the existing building and raising the bar on the airport experience and sustainability.

## SEA Tenants Donate to Community Food Bank



At one time, SEA dining establishments threw away thousands of pounds of food each year that was still safe and edible but did not meet the business requirements for sale.
